Jephthah Part II

This is another of the writer's attacks against the people of the period. That they would make foolish vows and perhaps even try to carry them out. The Law provided atonement for those that made rash vows. A wrong cannot be righted by another wrong. I imagine that Jephthah was not the type of person that spent time reading Leviticus. If the man had read the Law, his daughter would not have needed to fear for her life. One of the themes of Judges continues, an innocent woman suffers because of the ignorance of a leader.

⁴ "If anyone makes a rash vow, whether the vow is good or bad, when he realizes what a foolish vow he has taken, he is guilty.

⁵ "In any of these cases, he shall confess his sin ⁶ and bring his guilt offering to the Lord, a female lamb or goat, and the priest shall make atonement for him, and he shall be freed from his sin, and need not fulfill the vow. (Leviticus 5:4-6, TLB)
