The Revelation Of Jesus Christ Workbook

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This is not an easy book. A misunderstanding of the Revelation can drag Christians to strange and terrible places where common sense is abandoned. To prevent that from happening to us, we need to dedicate the time to understand this book with a simple, logical, and biblical approach. This way we can negate any misunderstanding of Revelation that we are approached with in our future.

Paul said that all scripture is inspired by God and beneficial. The Revelation is scripture, so it is beneficial. It is something that makes men and women of God complete, thoroughly equipped for every good work. I believe that once we have invested the energy to understand the book, we will find the Revelation to be rich, encouraging, and beneficial for our lives with Christ. Hopefully, this class and workbook will aid us to reach that goal.

Layout of the Revelation

Jesus gives John His Revelation of things that will soon take place. John passes on this information to the Christians in Asia. The first thing Jesus addresses is His awareness of what is going on in seven local churches in Asia. He knows about the good and the bad and commands repentance where it is needed. We discover from the first three chapters that these Christians in Asia have been under heavy persecution; one of them has even been murdered for his faith. Jesus takes the opportunity to ensure the Christians about the near future. He guarantees that He is aware of the situation, and He is about to do great things to preserve His people.

Chapter 4 changes the pattern of the vision. John is taken before the throne of God. From that point through the rest of the book, the Revelation becomes more like Ezekiel or Daniel than that of a New Testament epistle. God showed Ezekiel and Daniel the future of God's people by using visions of incredible beasts, events, and imagery to explain the movement of the nations and kings. God does this again, by giving John a vision of the things that will soon take place. It is revealed that many of the major events in the first century were caused by the Lord or the devil. The Lord assures Christians through John that He is in complete control of these events and that ultimately these events will lead to protection of His church.

The Date

When we get to chapter 6, we will need to address the dating of the book to explain the symbols of the book. The date identifies the major "villain" of the book that the Lord is going to destroy. If you believe that Revelation was recorded **before** 70 AD, the major villain of the book is Jerusalem. If you believe that Revelation was recorded **after** 70 AD, the major villain is Rome. I am going to try to do my best to explain both positions and let you decide for yourself. Our lesson questions, however, will not be about history, but exclusively about what John wrote.

Please do not confuse the date with what some have labeled as the "70 AD Doctrine." The "70 AD Doctrine" is a belief that **all** New Testament prophecies were fulfilled at the destruction of Jerusalem. So, they do not believe that Jesus is coming back to destroy the world and begin the final judgment. That belief ignores simple passages like 2 Peter 3, 1 Corinthians 15, and 2nd Thessalonians 1. The "70 AD Doctrine" is a false teaching that is another misunderstanding of the Revelation.

We will need to read a whole chapter per class. Since the reading is heavy, the questions will be light. You will get out of this class what you put into it. If you do the reading and do the questions, you will enjoy this class; however, if you do not plan to prepare, then prepare for a miserable three months.
